Thank you for your attention to this information. Nearly 70 student chairs are involved on this roster. Not everyone who wants to be in an ensemble can always be placed. These placements were worked out in consultation with your studio teachers. It is not always the case that only the least-experienced students don't get placed. Often there is a gap in experience-levels between players that suggests that inserting a given player is an inappropriate fit; so we don't assign that player to an SJE. Sometimes it is driven by schedule limitations of the student.

JO assignments are designed to enhance the sections and thus the bands. Sometimes the stronger players are not sitting where you'd expect them: their locale assists the sound of the ensemble.

Auditions are an excellent opportunity to gain feedback from the faculty. If you auditioned, please see us for input about your audition and how to improve yet more for the future. I have many pages of notes to share on these auditions. Also make good use of our practice rooms and buildings! And when you do, please take utmost care in maintaining their condition.
